- 1 You must possess your own instrument or have regular access to one.
- 2 Courses are run on a weekly basis, 30 minutes to 2 hours, depending on level and course, for practical and theoretical classes. In addition, ensemble music practice is compulsory as from the second cycle of studies.
- 3 Courses are run mainly from Monday to Friday between 15h and 20h, and on Saturdays between 8h30 and 15h.
- 4 Further to filling this application, you may be called for an Aptitude Test (absolute beginners) or a Selection Test (those with experience).

Aptitude test will be carried out between 27th July and 29th July 2020.

- 5 **Very Important: There will be no Aptitude test for Jardin Musical, Guitar Accompaniment, Keyboard, Hobby Drums, Accordion, Creole Music, Ukulele, Indian Music, POP Music (Guitar Electrical, Guitar Bass, Piano Modern and Drum Modern) and Winds Instrument (Saxophone, Clarinet, Flute, Recorder, Trumpet, Trombone, Horn and Oboe). Registration will be as follows: (i) Guitar Accompaniment, Ukulele and Creole Music: 10th August 2020 (ii) Keyboard, Hobby Drums and Indian Music: 11th August 2020 and (iii) Jardin Musical, POP Instrument and Wind Instruments: 12th August 2020 between 10h - 11h30 and 13h - 14h at the seat of the Conservatoire, Quatre Bornes. Please see the fees at the end of the application. You are requested to bring also a photo passport and a copy of birth certificate or National Identity Card of the applicant for verification purposes.**

The students must be age 8 by 31st August 2021 and no further correspondence will be sent to you.

- 6 Courses are free, but you will be required to pay a Registration Fee if you are selected. This fee is not refundable. Fee is refundable only if it is a transfer from Hobby to Formal Courses.
- 7 Non payment of registration fees will automatically result in dismissal from the Conservatoire National de Musique François-Mitterrand.
- 8 Please use one form per person to fill in all the courses asked.
- 9 Please make sure that you have read the 'Admission Procedures Sheet' before filling in this Application Form.
- 10 Applications will not be considered if not properly filled in or if received after the prescribed closing date and time.

ADMISSION PROCEDURES

1 New application for Conservatoire courses are normally issued in May each year for the new academic year starting in September. The closing date for submission/ posting of applications is normally in June each year. Notice about availability of application forms is made through newspapers and Conservatoire's Facebook page.

2 After the forms have been received and processed by the Conservatoire, eligible candidates may be convened for an aptitude or a selection test as mentioned below:

Aptitude test will be carried out between 27 July 2020 - 29 July 2020

3 Jardin Musical 1 & 2

Jardin Musical courses are meant for children aged 6 & 7. No specific instrument is taught in those classes, but children learn basic Music concepts such as rhythm, pitch, movement, texture.

There will be no aptitude test for Jardin Musical 1 & 2.

Age for admission in Jardin Musical courses:

Jardin Musical 1: prospective students **should** be age 6 by 31st August 2021.

Jardin Musical 2: prospective students **should** be age 7 by 31st August 2021.

Registration will be on 12th August 2020 between 10h-11h30 and 13h-14h at the seat of the Conservatoire, Quatre Bornes.

You are requested to bring a photo passport and a copy of the birth certificate of the applicant for verification purposes.

4 Formal Courses

Formal classes are all subject to formal examinations and continuous assessment. Students must follow practical and theoretical classes, as well as any other activity prescribed in the Internal Rules and Regulations of the Conservatoire.

Age for admission in formal courses:

(i) Instrumental classes – Absolute beginners

For the following instruments: violin, viola, cello, doublebass, recorder, flute, oboe, clarinet, saxophone, horn, trumpet, trombone, classical guitar, classical piano and percussions (classical), prospective students must have attained the age of **8 but not 35** by 31st August 2021

For flute, recorder, horn, oboe, clarinet, trumpet, trombone and saxophone no selection test will be required and payment will be on 12th August 2020 between 10h - 11h30 and 13h - 14h at the seat of the Conservatoire, Quatre Bornes.

(ii) Voice classes – Absolute beginners

For Year 1 (absolute beginners) voice classes, prospective students must have attained the age of **18 but not 35** by 31st August 2021.

(iii) Courses with pre-requisites

For the following courses: electric guitar, bass guitar, modern piano, drums, jazz saxophone and jazz trumpet prospective students must have attained the age of **11 but not 35** by 31st August 2021. Students must be able to play scales and one piece at Year 3 level (Grade 2) or Level 2 of Guitar Accompaniment, Keyboard or Drums. No selection test will be required and payment will be on 12th August 2020 between 10h - 11h30 and 13h - 14h at the seat of the Conservatoire, Quatre Bornes

(iv) Instrumental and voice classes – Students with experience

For applicants who already have musical experience/knowledge and wish to join the Conservatoire at a level other than beginner (Year 2 or successive years), the age limit is as follows: prospective students must not have attained the age of 35 by 31st August 2021.

Aptitude and Selection Tests for formal courses

There are different aptitude and selection tests for formal courses. Applicants are urged to be fully aware of the various requirements for the courses they wish to follow, as listed below:

(i) Aptitude test for Instrumental classes – Absolute beginners

Applicants are admitted following an aptitude test which consists of the following items:

(iii) Instrumental classes – Students with experience

For applicants who already have musical experience/knowledge and wish to join the Conservatoire at a level other than beginner, the selection test will consist of the following items, which must reflect the level of proficiency stated on the application form:

(i) One piece	(20 marks)
(ii) Scales & arpeggios	(20 marks)
(iii) Aural perception	(20 marks)
(iv) Sight reading	(20 marks)
(v) General music knowledge	(20 marks)

(iv) Students coming from Jardin Musical classes

Students coming from this course and who wish to join any other course should apply through the standard application procedures.

5 Formal Courses with pre-requisites, Formal Courses (Wind instrument), Group courses, ensembles, open classes, hobby classes

Very Important: There will be no Aptitude test for Jardin Musical, Guitar Accompaniment, Keyboard, Hobby Drums, Accordion, Creole Music, Ukulele, Indian Music, POP Music (Guitar Electrical, Guitar Bass, Piano Modern, and Drum Modern) and Winds Instrument (Saxophone, Clarinet, Flute, Recorder, Trumpet, Trombone, Horn and Oboe). Registration will be as follows: (i) Guitar Accompaniment, Ukulele and Creole Music: 10th August 2020, (ii) Keyboard, Hobby Drums and Indian Music: 11th August 2020 and (iii) Jardin Musical, POP Instrument and Wind Instruments: 12th August 2020 between 10h - 11h30 and 13h - 14h at the seat of the Conservatoire, Quatre Bornes Please see the fees at the end of the application. You are requested to bring also a photo passport and a copy of birth certificate or National Identity Card of the applicant for verification purposes.

- (i) For Group courses and hobby classes, the students must be age 8 by 31st August 2021. Courses are delivered by one teacher to a group class. Please see the fees at the end of the application.
- (ii) For Orchestra, Marching Band and Wind Ensemble, applicants must have at least practical proficiency at the level of Cycle One of studies at the Conservatoire, or equivalent (such as Grade 3 ABRSM or playing experience). Age limit applies only to the Marching Band where students must be not less than 11 years at the time of enrolment (except for section leaders).
- (iii) For Junior Orchestra, applicants must have at least one year experience in playing an orchestral instrument.
- (iv) For Choir (Adult and Children), there will be a test consisting of:

(i) Tone quality	(30 marks)
(ii) Melodic memory	(30 marks)
(iii) Pitch accuracy	(30 marks)
(iv) Sight reading	(10 marks)
TOTAL	(100 marks)
- (v) For Pop Band, this activity is for applicants who already have a band and wish to rehearse regularly. This is not a course, but students are provided with the necessary equipment to rehearse. Admission will depend strictly on availability of Auditorium.
